

List of Master Maps

Bac Phan (on left) 166 x 174 The large bend in the Clear River or Song Lo.

Chu-Dreh Pass (on right) 88 x 150 Route 14 between Pleiku and Ban Me Thuot in the Central Highlands. Includes a portion of the Chu Dreh massif in the northwest.



Black River (on left) 124 x 163 The Black River or Song Hac Giang north of Bien Hoa. Map stretches from just south of where the Ngoi Lat joins the river at Tu Vu north to the bend in the river south of Ap da Chong. In the east is the base of the Tan Vien Son and Bavi Cote mountains.

Dien Bien Phu (on right) 204x 350 The whole valley in all it's glory. There is a separate map for the Castor Landings, before the French occupied and destroyed the town of Muong Thanh, converting it into the fortified camp known as Dien Bien Phu.



Dak Ayun 182 x 127 Route 19 in the Central Highlands where it crosses the Dak Ayun. The village of Plei Rinh (and French outpost) is at the center of the map.



Deo Cat (on left) 50x 100 A narrow strip of Colonial Route 4 as it runs along the Song Ky Cong.

Dong Khe (on right) 100 x 118. One of the main French outposts on RC4. China is a few km to the east.



Dong Que 86 x 74 A small section of the 'Street Without Joy' and the dunes and rice paddies surrounding along it.



MaoKhe (on left) 100 x 110 Industrial area to the northwest of Haiphong. Route 18 runs east-west. The mines of Mao Khe are in the north,

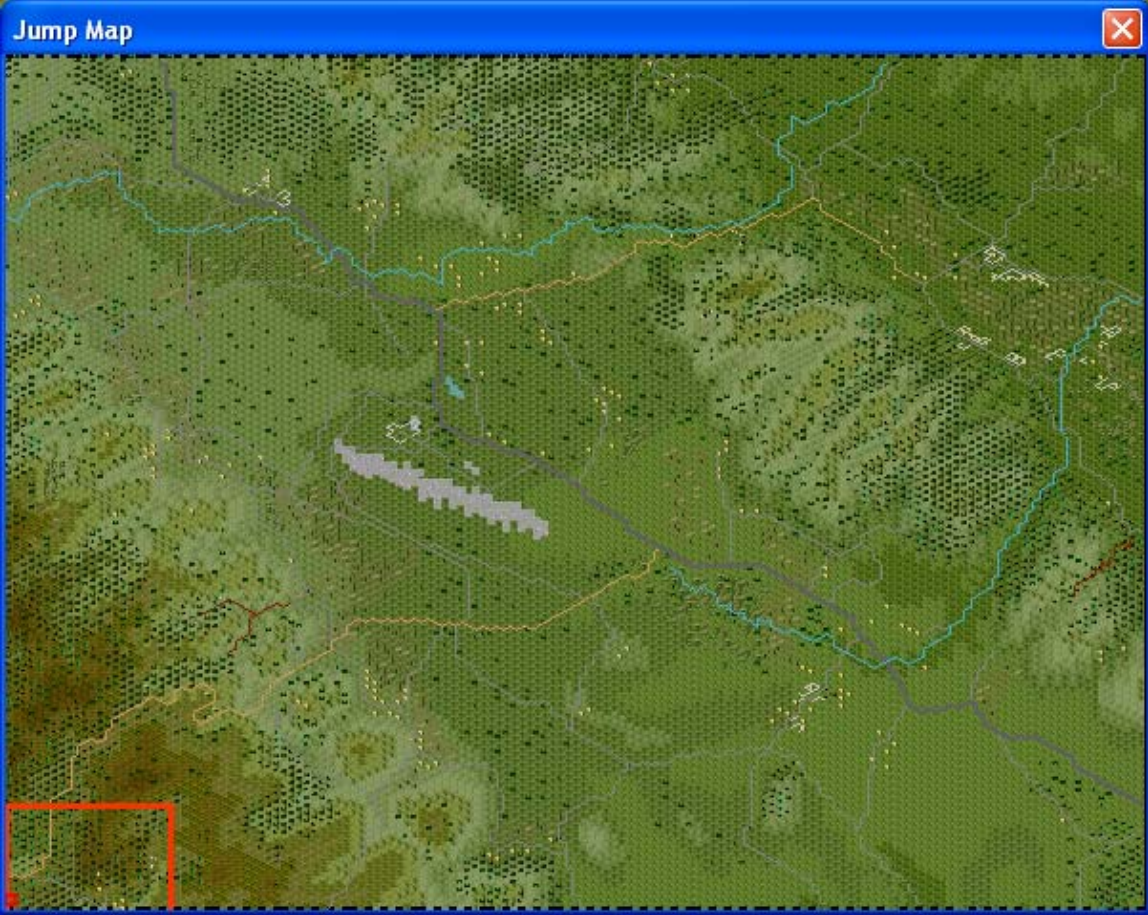
Lung Vai (on right) 60 x 125 Another long stretch of Colonial Route 4 between That Khe and Lang Son and scene of frequent ambushes.



Muong Khoua 116 x 72 A little bit of Laos, centered on the village of Muong Khoua at the junction of the Nam Pak and Nam Hou.



Na San 166 x 110 Centered on the airfield of Na San.



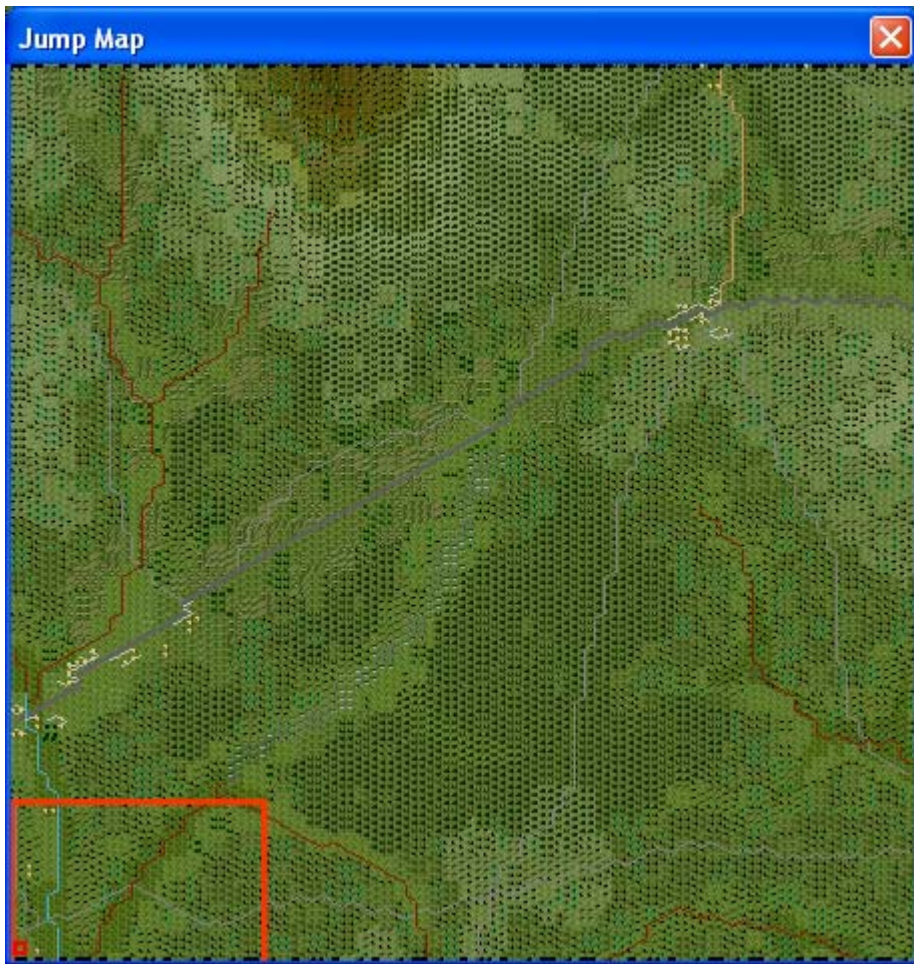
RC2-Chan Muong 86 x 104



Song Ky Cong 64 x 64 Colonial Route 4 at the crossing of the Song Ky Cong. A few kilometers south of That Khe.



Rt19 PK-3 86 x 75 GM 100 ambushes – Pleiku – Ankhe road, 3 km east of Pleiku.



Rt19 PK-15 226 x 80 GM 100 ambushes – Pleiku – Ankhe road, west of the Mang Yang Pass.
